Recent years have seen a drastic surge in [foreign information manipulation and interference \(FIMI\)](#). Foreign adversaries increasingly target European states by disseminating false or misleading information and suppressing important facts and narratives. As key information intermediaries, online platforms play an important role in both facilitating and countering foreign interference.

The EU is taking active measures to combat FIMI. Many recently adopted legal acts (including the Digital Services Act, the European Media Freedom Act, and the AI Act) prescribe mechanisms for curbing the spread of disinformation and interference in democratic processes. Many initiatives aimed at countering FIMI have also been undertaken by Member States. The Netherlands is one of the [frontrunners](#) in this field as it has adopted an innovative government-wide strategy for effectively tackling disinformation. Despite the strong need to protect the European information space from foreign interference, the effectiveness, legitimacy and long-term impact of some of the measures remain uncertain. The EU's sanctions against Russian news outlets, the growing criminalisation of disinformation in Member States, and the persistent ‘over-blocking’ practices of online platforms all pose substantial challenges to fundamental rights and democratic values. Democratic backsliding in multiple Member States, furthermore, raises the risk of the misuse of regulatory mechanisms for political objectives.

The workshop aims to take stock of the existing approaches to countering FIMI, with an emphasis on platform governance, and examine whether they strike a fair balance between responding adequately to hybrid attacks and safeguarding media freedom and the free exchange of information online.
